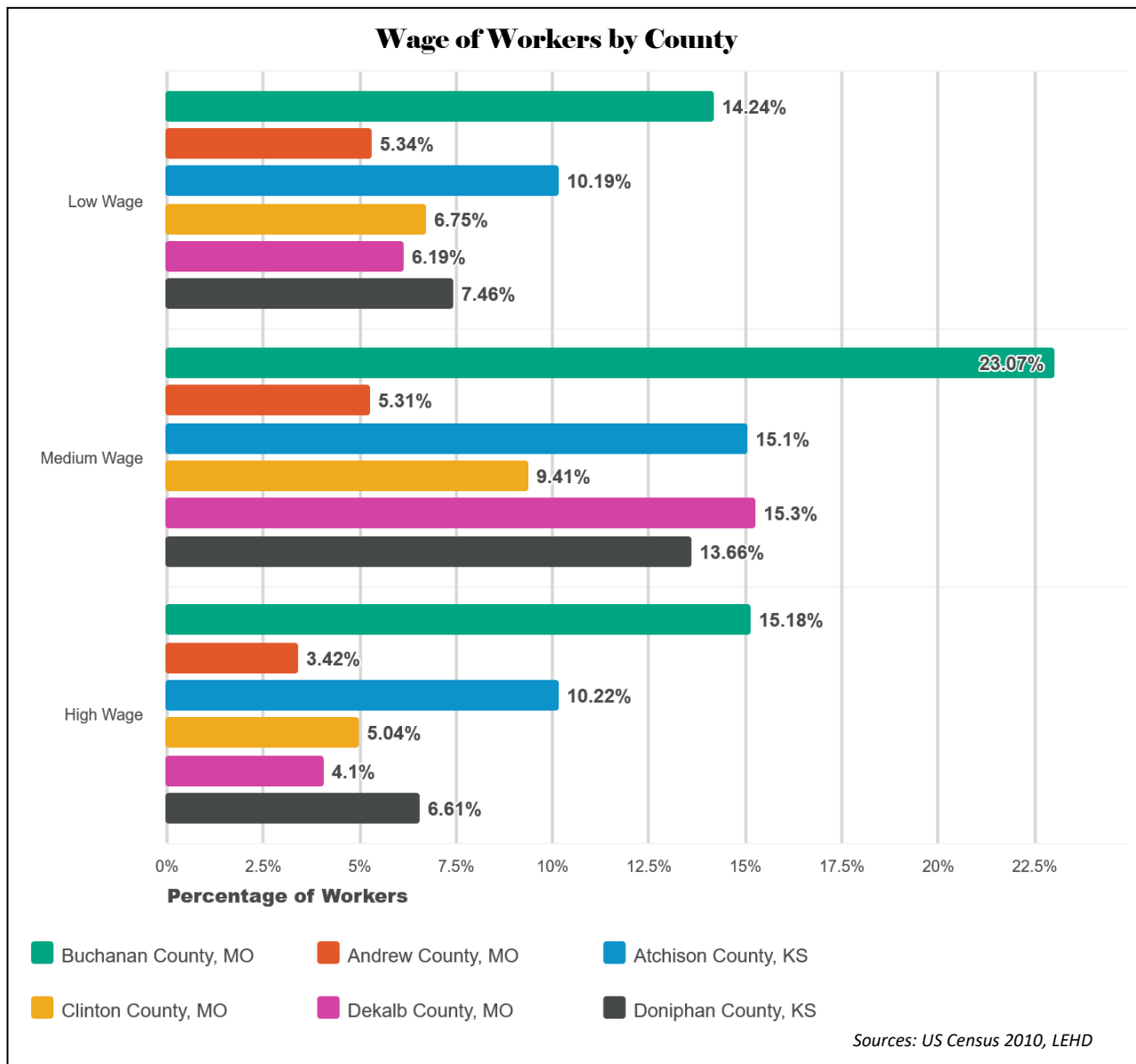
Wage Breakdown

The figure below shows the percentage of low-wage, medium-wage, and high-wage workers for the six Mo-Kan counties. The high number of low and medium-wage jobs shows the counties need to target higher paying jobs and industries to increase wages and stimulate economic growth.

Buchanan County has the highest percentage of high and medium wage workers. Andrew County has the smallest percentage of workers in all three

categories. Andrew County is primarily a bedroom community between St. Joseph to the south and Maryville to the north in Nodaway County.

Changes in these statistics will reflect the economic conditions going forward in each county. Service, retail, and food service jobs characteristically pay lower wages than the trades and manufacturing. The high wage earners are degreed professionals and workers with special certifications.



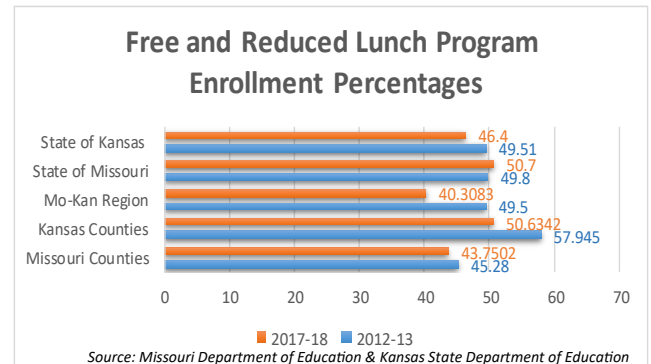
Education

For many places in the Mo-Kan Region, the schools are an integral part of the community, where its members work, support their hometown teams, and entrust others with their children's educations.

There are 19 public school districts in the region: five in Kansas and the remaining 14 in Missouri, serving 22,340 students. Another 11 private schools, nine in St. Joseph, and two in Atchison, KS, serve about 1,600 students pre-kindergarten to grade 12. Recently, the Savannah and Cameron school districts have added HeadStart programs with the help of CDBG grants administered by Mo-Kan staff to meet the early childhood educational needs of children from low to moderate income families in those communities.

FREE & REDUCED LUNCH PROGRAM

The free and reduced lunch program through the U.S.D.A. National School Lunch Program (NSLP) is available to students who qualify for assistance based on household income and family size. Children from families with incomes at or below 130 percent of the Federal poverty level are eligible for free meals. Those with incomes between 130 and 185 percent of the Federal poverty level are eligible for reduced price meals. Enrollment numbers in the program are indicators of the economic stability of families in a particular school district or region. In 2018, the St. Joseph School District, located in Buchanan County, had the highest NSLP enrollment percentage in the region, with 71.4 percent of its more than



11,000 students qualifying for free and reduced lunches. Meanwhile, Mid-Buchanan School District, also in Buchanan County, had the lowest enrollment percentage at 22.6 percent of the roughly 750 students who go there.

Collectively, the Mo-Kan Region public school average enrollment of 43.7 percent was well below the state average of 50.7 percent for 2018. Atchison and Doniphan counties in Kansas were right on par with the state at 50.6 percent, while Andrew, Buchanan, Clinton, and DeKalb counties in Missouri averaged 40.3 percent free and reduced lunch enrollment in 2018.

Enrollment for the Mo-Kan region fell almost 10 percent from the 2012-13 to 2017-18 school years, indicating a decreased need for school lunch assistance. The Kansas counties' enrollment numbers also dropped by about 7 percent since the 2012-13 school year. In comparison, Missouri counties showed a two percent drop in NSLP since 2012-13.

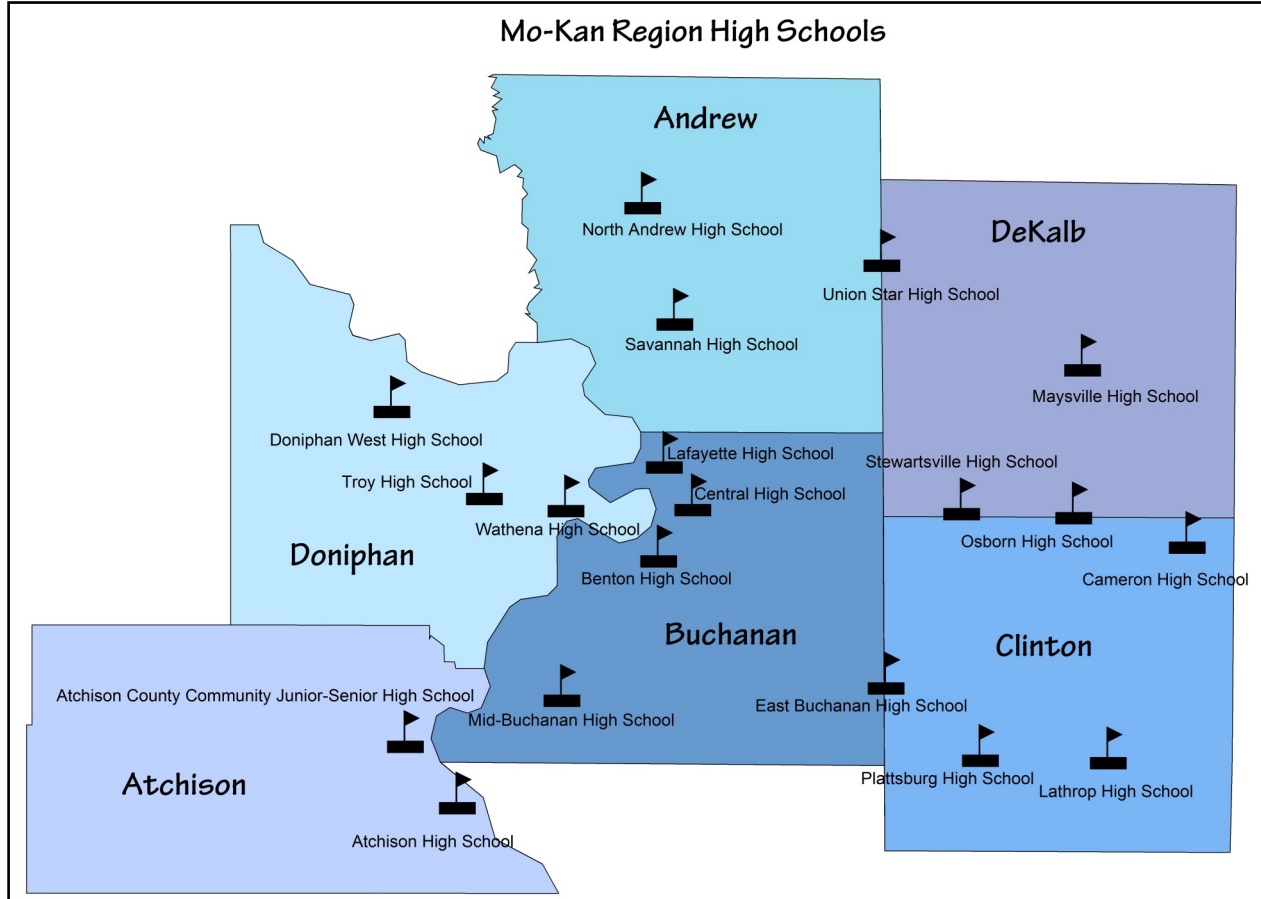
SCHOOL ENROLLMENT BY COUNTY AS OF 9/2019

**Post Secondary Schools**

St. Joseph is home to Missouri Western State University (MWSU), a four-year school. The state-supported institution provides a variety of degree programs and offers professional master's degrees, four-year baccalaureate degrees, two-year associate degrees, pre-professional transfer programs and one-year certificates. In addition, MWSU offers continuing education courses, seminars, conferences and workshops suited to the needs of the community. There are also two technical schools in St. Joseph, American Business and Technology University and Hillyard Technical Center.

Highland Community College, in Doniphan County, was the first college in Kansas and has about 3,000 students at its five locations. Another Kansas institution, Benedictine College, located in

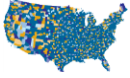

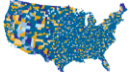

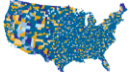
